The Cumulative Grant Project Status Summary report reflects changes since the September 2012 update. Each project is identified by funding source, proposition 13, 40, 50, 50GA, and 84; project name; applicant name; allocated amount; and the project status. The report is sorted between completed and certified projects in alphabetical order by project name. The status section for each grant has been updated to provide additional detail on the grantees' current activities and progress toward project completion.

As shown in this report, the RMC has authorized 195 total projects, 160 of which are completed, and the balance of 35 projects are "certified"; meaning they are active, approved projects in which funds have been encumbered.
