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The purpose of this report attached as Exhibit A is to provide a monthly update as to the status of each approved project under proposition 40, 50, and 84. The information contained in the report is project name, applicant name, allocated amount, and the project status. The report is also sorted in alphabetical order by project name. The status section for each grant has been updated to provide additional detail on the grantees' current activities and progress toward project completion.

As shown in this report the RMC has authorized 172 total projects, 125 of which are completed, and the balance of 47 projects are "certified" which means that they are active, approved projects which have been encumbered.
